# Can you help?

We are looking for items that you might be throwing away or replacing and we like to recycle unwanted items, if you can help with our following list, that would be amazing

#### What should I do if my child is sick or unwell?

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea they should be absent from nursery until at least 48 hours after their last bout. These procedures ensure the health and safety of everyone at Eastwood Nursery. There is no exclusion period for children with hand foot and mouth or conjunctivitis, however you should seek medical advice. If your child has chicken pox they should stay home until all spots are scabbed over and no longer seeping.

If your child is prescribed antibiotics they must have had them for 48 hours before returning to nursery and before we will administer them here. This is to ensure your child has no adverse reaction to the medication.

The nursery will not administer Calpol or any other form of paracetamol type medication, unless this has been prescribed by GP for a specific reason. If you feel your child needs this throughout the day we advise that they probably shouldn't attend nursery that day.

Please call the nursery to let us know if your child will be absent so we can let their keyworker know.

If your child requires any medication or creams whilst at nursery this must be prescribed and labelled by a doctor/pharmacist and forms completed before we can administer any medication.
